## ABA TOPIC OF THE MONTH

**Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA):** A graduate-level certification in behavior analysis. Individuals with a BCBA certification may supervise Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analysts (BCaBAs), Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs), or any other professionals who implement behavior-analytic interventions.

### Requirements:

- Master's degree in ABA, education, psychology, child development, or related field.
- 2,000 hours of field work experience.
- Passing the BCBA Exam

### Job Responsibilities may include:

- Oversee a team of behavior technicians and/or master's level supervisors completing their field work hours.
- Train behavior technicians and parents in ABA related interventions.
- Conduct face-to-face supervision during sessions.
- Develop individualized function-based treatment plans for clients.
- Develop and monitor skill acquisition goals/progress.
- Conduct assessments (FBA, FAs, Preference Assessments, etc).
- Write FBA and progress reports for continuation of services.
